



YOU NEED TO KNOW

CLASS SIZE & INSTRUCTORS

Classes are limited to 20 children. Staff ratios are 6:1 for 5 year-olds, 8:1 for 6–7 year-olds, and 10:1 for children 8 and older. Instructors hold degrees or diplomas and have professional and teaching experience. Assistants are senior secondary school or university students who have extensive experience in educational programs. Each group also has two or more volunteers to provide additional support.

ENTRANCE TO THE MUSEUM

Is via the President's Choice School Entrance at the south side of the building. Go down the small set of stairs between the Museum and the Planetarium and through the first set of glass doors on the right. You will be greeted inside these doors.

DROP-OFF & PICK-UP

There is no parking available at the Museum. There is a school bus loading zone along Queen's Park on the east side of the ROM where you may drop-off and pick-up your children briefly. Parking your car in this area and/or blocking the TTC stop are considered by the police to be parking violations and you may be ticketed. The Museum assumes no responsibility for such violations nor can we assist you with parking tickets.

The TTC also stops at our door on both subway and surface routes. Call 416.393.INFO for details.

SUPERVISED DROP-OFF

Summer Club Staff are available from 8:30 to 9 am at the school bus drop-off zone on the east side of the ROM on Queen's Park, and at the turnstiles in the Museum TTC Station to escort campers to their morning groups. Staff can be identified by staff shirts and badges.

EARLY BIRD FILMS

Drop off your child between 8 and 9 am for our free early bird films that are offered before official programming begins.



YOU NEED TO KNOW (CONT)

LUNCH

Afternoon and full-day participants have a supervised lunch in *Philosopher's Walk* (weather permitting) behind the Museum. Children should bring their own bag lunches, drinks and snacks. **No nuts please.**

DAILY SCHEDULE

Programs are two weeks in length (one week during session 5), daily Monday to Friday.



Morning Programs run from 9 am to 12 pm.

Afternoon Programs run from 1 pm to 4 pm (following a supervised lunch from 12 to 1 pm).

Morning combined with **Afternoon Programs** or **Full-day Programs** run from 9 am to 4 pm (including a supervised lunch in the park behind the museum, weather permitting, from 12 to 1 pm).

Supervised mid-morning and mid-afternoon **breaks** take place outdoors in the park behind the Museum, weather permitting.

Children bring their own lunch and snacks. **No nuts please.**

Typical daily programs begin with a visit to a Museum gallery that sets the context for a creative project or experiment in the Museum's studio, classrooms or labs.

Busing is not available.

EXTENDED CARE

4 to 6 pm: Extended care, consisting of relaxed, supervised activities, will be available for a limited number of children enrolled in afternoon or full-day options. It will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Please consult the fee schedule and be sure to check off the appropriate section on the registration form.

YOUR CHILD'S SAFETY/PICK-UP

Children **must** be picked up promptly after programs or extended care ends. Late fees of \$1/minute apply.

We do not permit children to leave unattended. If your child is 11-16 years of age he/she can leave on his/her own if he/she has a signed note from home noting permission for relevant dates. Please provide a note if you know in advance if your child is going to be absent. Please telephone 416.586.8043 if your child is ill and will not be attending.

Children are released only to people whose photo ID matches the name(s) submitted as authorized pick-up people. Names can be added to this list throughout the session.

CANCELLATIONS & REFUNDS

Cancellations must be received in writing no less than **two weeks prior** to the course date for a refund of 80%.

After this time, any such request will be processed only if accompanied by a medical certificate and received prior to the end of the first week of the camp period.

In the case of insufficient registrations for any course, we reserve the right to cancel the program, and a full refund will be forthcoming with the option to transfer to another available course.

Art Express Age 5

No corner of the Museum will be missed and no facet of the arts overlooked as you act, draw, paint, and sculpt your way around the world.

DinoMite AGE 5

Get up close and personal with the biggest residents of the ROM ... the dinosaurs! Hear about the adventures of ROM palaeontologists, learn about how they know where to look, and how they get these massive fossil finds out of the earth and back to the Museum. Use the ROM's galleries as inspiration as you try your hand at making fossils and recreating your own dino friend for home!

ROM Sense AGE 5

Discover a whole new world of sensations as you explore the ROM's amazing galleries. Eew & Awe Ages 6–7

Try your hand at creepy crafts, revolting recipes and squishy science experiments. 

Learn about amazing architecture from ant hills to ancient fortresses, then construct your own marvellous models for home.

Science Sleuths Ages 6–7

Have you ever wanted to be a scientist and solve the mysteries of everyday life? Well here's your chance! Conduct simple experiments to find out why the sky is blue, why leaves change colour in the fall, and what paper airplane design flies the farthest. Your investigations will take you from the microscopic level of the cell to the cosmic level of the stars in a mini-planetarium.

Suit Yourself Ages 6–7

Fashion yourself a trunk full of hats and costumes as you take an imaginative journey through our galleries! Learn how different cultures clothed themselves through history and take inspiration from the natural world full of prints and patterns. Then, using paint, paper, fabric and more, you'll create outfits and accessories to suit yourself in this crazy costume caper!

Wild About Art Ages 6–7

Travel to the African Savannah, explore your own backyard, and peer at nature's oddest critters. Gain a fresh perspective on the patterns and textures in nature, and plenty of inspiration for your own artistic creations. A leopard becomes concealed in a camouflage collage, dinosaur tracks are transformed into one-of-a-kind prints, and a fruit bat becomes animated as a friendly puppet. Go wild for these wacky art projects.

Ancient Cities Ages 8–10

Travel in the footsteps of Alexander the Great, the rulers of the Forbidden City and other adventurers as you uncover the greatness of ancient cities and civilizations. Along the banks of the Nile River, across Roman roads, up the steps of Greek temples and massive ziggurats, witness discoveries that became the foundations of the modern world. Get your hands on history as you tackle timely technologies, uncrack codes of ancient writing, try your hand at clever experiments and conquer your own empires.



Drawing from Nature

Ages 8–10

Across cultures and throughout history, the natural world has been a source of endless artistic inspiration. Visit the ROM's Asian, Egyptian, European, and First Peoples galleries to discover how nature features in the art of these very different cultures. The Natural History galleries will serve as your inspiration as you use a variety of techniques, including sketching, shading, blind contour, and eraser drawing to create your own wild and wonderful works of art.

Dino Days Ages 8–10

Spend the day exploring the every day lives of the most awesome creatures ever to have walked the earth, and the amazing palaeontologists who search for them millions of years after their extinction. How do they get fossils from the badlands of Alberta to displaying them in museums around the world? Which dinosaurs were solitary, which hunted in packs, and why? If all you think about is dinosaurs, then Dino Days is for you.

Dragoneers Ages 8–10

We all know that dragons never really existed ... or did they? Explore the ROM's galleries and discover depictions of dragons throughout history. Travel out into the wild to observe some modern-day dragons in their natural habitat. Conduct some scientific experiments to discover the best way to help our dragons fly, and put together a guide on how to train your very own ROM dragon.

Explorers & Expeditions

Ages 8–10

Follow in the footsteps of famous and infamous explorers. Record an Egyptian expedition to the mysterious land of Punt, join Henry Hudson and his brave "Adventurers" as they search for the elusive Northwest Passage, or sail the seas with one of the famous pirates ever, Ching Shih. Map out routes, create 3D landscapes, and master timeless tricks of the navigation trade.


Land & Sea Ages 8–10

Wildlife Wonders Ages 8–10

Weird Science Ages 8–10

From trilobites, glyptodonts, and giant ground sloths to meat-eating plants, flying foxes, feathered dinosaurs, bizarre creatures have always existed. By examining fossils, skins, skeletons, and live specimens and doing your own creative projects, learn about evolution's strangest solutions.

Web of Life Ages 8–10

Calling all nature lovers! Study rocks, minerals, food chain dynamics, and predator-prey interactions in this experimental approach to everything from pythons to protozoa. Visits to the Age of Dinosaurs gallery will provide a portal for surveying prehistoric biodiversity, while explorations of the Schad Gallery of Biodiversity will extend your studies to the world we live in today and the interconnectedness of life.

Animal Alphabet Age 5

From aardvarks to zebras, celebrate the ABCs, ROM-style! Whether you're diving to the depths of the sea or enjoying a birds-eye view of the forest below, no angle will be overlooked in this interactive journey. Use a variety of creative art techniques like collage, finger painting, photo transfer, and stenciling to create your own illustrated alphabet book, inspired by your many animal adventures.

Call of the Wild Age 5

From hissing cockroaches to flashing fireflies, discover the ins and outs of animal communication. Choreograph a bee dance, imitate your favourite bird calls, and join in a wolf-howling expedition. Creative projects, crafts, and games will unleash your wild side!



Nature Nuts Age 5

Come and take a walk on the wild side of the ROM. On your adventures, peek inside a beehive, hide in a fox's den, explore a fallen tree and come face to face with the animals that call these special places home. Learn all about your favourite furry friends while you play nature inspired games and activities. The many animals you meet on your habitat hunts will inspire painting, clay and other wild and wonderful creations.

Time Bandits Age 5

Spend your summer days caught in a time warp. Climb into your time machine and discover a few billion years of history right under your nose! Colourful collages and dazzling drawings will help you to capture each day's voyage. Whether you're donning a helmet and shield for a gallant tournament or treading in the footprints of a mighty Maiasaur, after this adventure, the twenty-first century will seem rather dull.

Wondertales Age 5

Take a journey across the continents as you listen to wondrous tales from around the world. The Museum's galleries will set the scene for re-enacting stories of ambitious animals, proud princesses, tricky spiders, and spur you on to spin your own tales of wonder!

Far Out East Ages 6–7

Prepare for an eye-opening journey east of the Mediterranean. Follow ancient trade routes and explore the amazing innovations that formed civilization as we know it. Ages 8–10

Our special theatre school will draw on the Museum's rich cultural and dramatic back drop to enhance your acting abilities through training in the voice, movement, expression and dialogue. All you learn will culminate in a final performance worthy of a Shakespearean stage.



Architreks Ages 8–10

Use the ROM as a launching point as we study architecture old and new. Encounter some of the world's most amazing feats of engineering. From ancient fortifications, to funerary monuments, to cutting edge museums, architecture has shaped the world around us. Put on your walking shoes and join us as we trek around the city learning about the history of man-made structures and how they have evolved into the city around us.

Beyond Boundaries Ages 8–10

Break the boundaries of culture and science! Science, art, and history fuse, as you experiment with chemical reactions to create fine works of art, investigate the mysterious relationship between astronomy and pyramid design, or use the study of mineralogy to create detailed paintings. Prepare to be amazed by your new multi-disciplinary perspective on the world.
