



FREE WALKS

Walks start Sundays at 2:00 pm and Wednesdays at 6:00 pm.

DOWNTOWN

Along the Front

Walk along Front Street where the Town of York (now Toronto) had a bustling market at Front and Jarvis streets.

Explore the elegant Flatiron Building, Royal York Hotel, spacious theatres, the breathtaking Galleria, and more.

Start: NW corner of Front St. & George St. (near 106 Front St. E., Toronto)

End: Front St. W. and Bay St. (near Fairmont Royal York Hotel, 100 Front St. W.)

Queen's Park: Monuments in Memory

Enjoy a crash course in Canadian history from 1870 to today in the stories – some controversial – of public memorials on the grounds of Queen's Park.

Start: 48th Highlanders Memorial (opposite 78 Queen's Park - where Queen's Park becomes Queen's Park Cres. E. and W.)

End: Canadian Volunteer Monument (Hart House Circle and Queen's Park Cres. W.)

Yorkville

Evolving from an 1800's tollgate village at the edge of Toronto to an upscale commercial destination, see how this iconic neighbourhood has maintained its character despite being engulfed by the city.

Start: Yorkville Library, 22 Yorkville Ave., Toronto

End: ROM, corner of Bloor St. and Queen's Park (100 Queen's Park, Toronto)

WEST

Annex East

An engaging introduction to the city's first planned suburb for professional and upper middle-class residents highlights 200 years of unique Toronto architecture.

Start: Taddle Creek Park (40 Bedford Rd. at Lowther)

End: Bloor St. and St. George

Grange

Learn how the Grange developed from a colonial park property owned by Toronto's early elite to become a lively neighbourhood of immigrants, workers, and socially-minded professionals.

Start: SW corner McCaul St. and Dundas St. W. (near 317 Dundas St. W., Toronto)

End: Grange Park

Park Lawn Cemetery

Walk with us through the 4th largest cemetery in the city. Founded in 1892, it includes graves of prominent local sports figures, reporters, politicians, and more.

Start/End: Entrance to Park Lawn Cemetery at 308 Prince Edward Dr. (across from the Fire Station).

EAST

Cabbagetown North

Learn more about this heritage community, dating back to the mid 1850s and brought back to life through restoration, renovation and community pride.

Start: NE corner Parliament St. and Winchester St. (near 539 Parliament St.)

End: Parliament St. and Wellesley St.

Riverside: Change Over Time

Hear fascinating stories of architecture, art, baseball, bridges, marmalade, meeting halls, factories, railways and more.

Start: Parkette bounded by King St. E., Queen St. E., and River St. / North side of King St. E. (across from 599 King St. E., Toronto)

End: Queen St. E. at Jimmy Simpson Park (near 870 Queen St. E., Toronto)

Whiskey, Wharf, and Windmill

Walk with us and encounter the last and largest example of Victorian-era industrial architecture. Developed "east of the windmill", this neighbourhood holds a legacy of immigration, industry, and the making of a wealthy city.

Start: St. Paul's Basilica at Queen St. E. and Power St. (83 Power Street)

End: 11 Trinity St. (south of Queen St. E. and Power St.)

Fin : Grange Park
