


A Taste of the Season Thursday, December 7



The New Hamilton Friday, August 11



Experience the revitalized city of Hamilton. A trolley ride along the Inner Harbour and guided tour of the city start a very full day which includes the city's burgeoning art scene as well as the advancements it's making in research and development. We visit the Cotton Factory, home to more than 80 artists; see Canada's biggest quilt, and tour the MacMaster Innovation Park, home of the "tech-med" incubators. The day ends with the monthly Art Crawl, a chance to stroll along James St. and see firsthand the talents of Hamilton's many artists.

Note that this is a full day tour, leaving at 8:30 a.m. and returning at 9 p.m. Treat yourself to an evening snack at the art show. Tour involves standing and walking.

Gothic and Lace Wednesday, September 13



Gothic architecture and fashion await in this full day tour. We will visit the new "Fashion History Museum" in Cambridge whose collection consists of nearly 10,000 garments and accessories dating from the 1660s to the present. We will view "The World of Jane Austen 1792 -1817" and "Fashioning Canada Since 1867" with curator Jonathan Walford.

Led by local expert, Joleen Taylor, we explore Gothic churches, the oldest built in 1844. If time permits we visit the University of Waterloo School of Architecture, (once a 1919 silk mill). We end the day with tea at MacDougall Cottage, an 1858 granite and limestone labourer's home.
