What does Morocco make you think of? Romantic medinas, colourful markets, the Atlas Mountains, snake charmers in Marrakech, camels in the Sahara Desert? We'll see all of these and much more as we explore the best this wonderful country has to offer. The trip will feature exclusive tours and less-visited sights. ROM Senior Curator of Global Africa, Silvia Forni, will enrich our experience.

We will start in Casablanca with a visit to one of the largest mosques in the world open to non-Muslims. Then on to Rabat, the capital, and Tangier, which formerly had a reputation for exotic decadence. Less well-known is charming Chefchaouen, with many houses painted a distinctive blue. The ruins of Volubilis remind us how important this Roman city once was. Fes, where we will stay in a traditional-style riad, feels like

Morocco from the past. A stroll around the medina reveals many delightful scenes, such as a zellij-tiled fountain or metalware market but watch out for cargo-laden donkeys!

On our drive through the Atlas Mountains, the scenery will amaze us. We'll spend a night in a luxurious camp in the Sahara and imagine the camel caravans that once transported gold and salt across the desert. We'll also stay in a ksar, a Moroccan castle or caravanserai, on our way to Marrakech. There we'll take in the highlights, including the bustling Jemaa el Fna Square and the Majorelle Garden, restored by Yves Saint Laurent and Pierre Berge.

Morocco's justifiably famous cuisine will be featured throughout the trip, and we'll enjoy a variety of entertainment including traditional music.

Do join us. It will be unforgettable!

Trip Itinerary and Highlights

Day 1 Arrivals in Casablanca

Individual arrivals at Casablanca Mohamed V Airport (CMN). Morning

group transfer to meeting point for those arriving on suggested flight. Visit to Hassan II Mosque and lunch at Rick's Café. Drive to Rabat.

Day 2 Rabat

Guided tour of the highlights of Rabat, including the medina, Oudaia Kasbah, Hassan Tower, Chellah and Archaeological Museum. Welcome dinner at Villa Mandarine.

Day 3 Rabat to Tangier

Drive to Tangier with stops at the Punic-Roman site of Lixus, Asilah, where we will visit the Hassan II Cultural Centre, the Caves of Hercules and Cap Spartel.

Day 4 Tangier

Guided tour of Tangier, including the Grand Socco, Mendoubia Gardens, Saint Andrew's Church, and medina. Dinner at Villa Josephine.




Figure 3: Royal Palace, Rabat, Morocco. © Bernard Gagnon, Wikimedia Commons, 2005.

Day 5 Tangier to Chefchaouen

Drive to Tetouan where we will visit the medina, contemporary art and archaeological museums and have lunch. We will continue to Chefchaouen,

the “Blue Pearl”, where we will tour the medina.

Day 6 Chefchaouen to Fes

On the way to Fes, we will visit N’zala Bni Amir, a women’s textile cooperative. Then we will tour the Roman site of Volubilis, with its wonderful mosaics.

Day 7 Fes

Walking tour of Fes El Bali to see its beautifully decorated medersas, vibrant souks, picturesque tanneries, and impressive gates. Special tour of the Karaouine University Library. Dinner with musical entertainment at Mnebhi Palace where the 1912 Treaty of Fes was signed.

Day 8 Fes

Excursion to the Imperial City of Meknes to see the Mausoleum of Moulay Ismail, Bou Inania Medersa and more. Lunch and wine tasting at Chateau Roslane. Remainder of the day free.

Day 9 Fes to Erfoud

Drive through the Atlas Mountains, with stops at Ifrane, with its Swiss-style chalets, Midelt and the Ziz Gorge.

Day 10 Erfoud to Desert Camp

Visit an Amazigh (Berber) village and learn to make “medfouna” (stuffed flatbread, a local specialty) which we will enjoy for lunch. Arrive at the camp for a camel ride and dinner with traditional music.

Day 11 Desert Camp to Ait Ben Haddou

Drive via Tinghir, the Todra Gorge and Skoura to Ait Ben Haddou for our stay in the Riad Ksar Ighnda.

Day 12 Ait Ben Haddou to Marrakech

Visit Ait Ben Haddou before driving to Marrakech. Evening walk to Jemaa el Fna Square when it is at its most vibrant.

Day 13 Marrakech

Tour of the Majorelle Garden, Berber Arts Museum and Yves Saint Laurent (YSL) Museum. Then we will visit the Museum of African Contemporary Art Al Maaden (MACAAL) and a studio or gallery. Lunch will be at the famous La Mamounia Hotel. Remainder of the day free.

Day 14 Marrakech

Morning tour of the medina, including the Bahia Palace, Dar Si Said Museum, Marrakech Museum and souks. Afternoon at leisure. Farewell dinner.

Day 15 Departures

Group transfer to Casablanca Mohamed V Airport (CMN) or Marrakech Airport (RAK). Individual departures.

Note: This trip involves considerable walking, often on uneven surfaces and slopes. It is not suitable for anyone who has difficulty walking or climbing stairs.

Worldwide Quest International requires all participants on this trip to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19. All trip leaders, guides and drivers will be fully vaccinated.

Living standards and practices at the destination and the standards and conditions there with respect to the provision of utilities, services and accommodation may differ from those found in Canada.

Trip Cost Per Person

All quoted costs are in Canadian dollars.

Double Occupancy: \$ 8,995

Single Supplement: \$ 1,995

Trip cost does not include international flight costs between your home and Morocco. Worldwide Quest International can assist with booking flights.

Tour begins at Casablanca Mohamed V Airport (CMN). Tour ends at either Casablanca Mohamed V Airport (CMN) or Marrakech Airport (RAK).

Trip Cost Includes

Group arrival transfer from Casablanca Airport (CMN) to meeting point on Day 1. Group departure transfer from hotel to Casablanca Airport (CMN) or Marrakech Airport (RAK) on Day 15.

Porterage of one standard sized suitcase per person at the hotels.

Ground transport in private air-conditioned coach for transfers and excursions as per itinerary and in 4 by 4 vehicles at the desert camp.

Shared accommodation in double occupancy room with private facilities and free WiFi access.

Meals: Buffet breakfast daily, 9 lunches and 11 dinners. All meals include choice of bottled water, coffee, tea or soft drink. Welcome and farewell dinners with wine. Other dinners include two glasses of wine or beer, when available, as some restaurants do not serve alcohol. Bottled water daily on the bus.

All visits, entrance fees, speakers' fees and events as per itinerary.

Headset listening devices throughout the tour.

All taxes and tips for all goods and services, drivers, hotel, restaurant, and guiding staff related to the basic trip.

Costs

All costs quoted herein are based on rates, fees, and taxes as of April 11, 2022. Costs are subject to change without notice. Should trip costs increase, Worldwide Quest International (as per TICO regulations) reserves the right to increase the cost accordingly up to a

maximum of 7%. Worldwide Quest reserves the right to substitute itineraries, hotels, airlines or vessels due to conditions beyond their control. Any change to itinerary will not result in eligibility for a refund.

Deposits and Final Payment

An initial non-refundable deposit of \$1,050.00 per person is required at the time of booking. A second non-refundable deposit of \$2,000.00 is due on December 2, 2022. The balance of payment of \$5,945.00 per person, and if applicable, single supplement of \$1,995.00, are due on February 2, 2023.

Reservations

As the number of participants is limited, reservations should be made as soon as possible. In the event of oversubscription, a waiting list will be maintained.

Physical Limitations or Disabilities

Any physical limitation or disability requiring special attention or treatment must be reported when reservation is made or when it occurs, if later. ROMTravel, Worldwide Quest International and/or its agents reserve the right to decline to accept or to retain anyone who may in their sole judgment

require care and attention beyond that which can be provided.

Cancellations

All cancellations must be made in writing to Worldwide Quest International. All payments are non-refundable. No refunds will be given for payments made or unused services.
