Egypt, a country poised as a bridge between Africa, Europe, and Asia for many millennia, beckons us to tread in the footsteps of its people, both ancient and modern. Jordan, "an open-air museum" that has remnants of many empires and civilizations – the Nabateans, the Romans, the Crusaders  invites us to explore the valley through which Moses is said to have led his people to Canaan.

We continue to Aswan and feel we have gone back in time as we visit the romantic Philae Temple and take a flight out to see the massive temples in Abu Simbel. We cruise downstream on the mighty river Nile and see the Valley of the Kings and Valley of the Queens along its banks. We marvel at the majestic Karnak Temple complex in Luxor and, amongst many monuments, visit the Temple of Hatshepsut.

Doctor Kei Yamamoto, Egyptologist, and former ROM researcher, joins us to augment this remarkable experience.
